## **THERE IS HOPE FOR SOME**

The third chapter of the book of Isaiah lists things any nation will lose when the Lord chastises them because of their unfaithfulness and sinfulness. That list may seem ominous but there is hope for those who are serving Him and are faithful to His calling. God inserted in that list a very special and precious promise. <sup>10</sup>*Tell the righteous it will be well with them, for they will enjoy the fruit of their deeds.* <sup>11</sup>*Woe to the wicked! Disaster is upon them! They will be paid back for what their hands have done.*” *Isaiah 3:10-11 New International Version*

I cannot tell you exactly how the Lord will bless the righteous while at the same time punishing the unrighteous within a nation. My opinion is that God said He would, I believe that He will do what He says, and that settles it.

He will not inflict on you the horrible diseases you knew in Egypt, but he will inflict them on all who hate you.* *Deuteronomy 7:12-15 NIV*
